


Enjoy our museums, water park, golf course, metal sculptures, city park with playground, and much more.




No tour of Washington would be complete without a visit to Ritzville. Settled in the 1880's, Ritzville was once the largest wheat shipping point in the world. Today it remains a community with a rich pioneer heritage.





The Dr. Frank R. Burroughs home was built in 1889 and extensively remodeled in 1902 when electricity came to Ritzville. A collection of vintage clothes and original furnishing await your visit.

Ritzville's Railroad Depot Museum is home to a collection of turn of the century memorabilia. Train lovers, young and old, will enjoy our newly restored Northern Pacific caboose as well as the fully functional telegraphy equipment complete with telegrapher.
